- 1. CALL TO ORDER Board President and Executive Committee Chair Murray called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. Roll Call indicated that 5 Trustees were present, and none were absent.

RESOLUTION 10-1

Resolution of the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District Establishing a Procedure for Electing Board Officers

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District, a special district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, held on the 8th day of March 2010, at 155 Mason Circle, Concord, California, a quorum being present, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2021, allows the board of supervisors and each city council within the district's boundaries to appoint members of the board of trustees; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2020, states the board of trustees shall establish policies for the operation of the district; and

WHEREAS, the California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2027, states at the first meeting in January every year, the board of trustees shall elect its officers; and

WHEREAS, it is to the advantage and best interests of the Contra Costa Mosquito & Vector Control District that all trustees are afforded the opportunity to serve as an officer of the board,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CONTRA COSTA MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT that the District hereby adopts the following procedure for annual election of officers in January.

- 1. Elected officers of the board shall consist of the President, Vice-President and Secretary.
- 2. Trustees should ascend to President based on a list according to their original appointment date. Once a trustee has served as President they should be removed from the list.
- 3. The trustee at the top of the list should be nominated, elected, and serve as President providing s/he has attended 2/3rds of the previous year's full board meetings.
- 4. The trustee second on the list should be nominated, elected and serve as Vice President providing s/he has attended 2/3rds of the previous year's full board meetings. Trustees who feel they can not fulfill the duties of one year as Vice President and then one year as President, should not request to serve as Vice

President. Those trustees that were eligible to serve as an officer but declined due to other commitments that year, may request to be placed one spot lower on the list to be eligible the next year.

- 5. Prior to ascending to the Vice President position, the Executive Committee shall determine if said Trustee will be asked to complete the four CSDA Special District Governance Academy courses for Trustees or if experience from another governing role or position qualifies as a substitute for said courses.
- 6. Minimum time as Trustee prior to serving as Vice President should be three years.
- 7. One trustee may serve as Board Secretary indefinitely, but election to this office must occur every January, along with the other board offices. Nominations for the position shall come from the floor.
- 8. Each board member present shall have one vote.

Resolution of the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District Revising the Procedure for Electing Board Officers

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Contra Costa Mosquito and Vector Control District, a special district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, held on the 13th day of January 2020, at 155 Mason Circle, Concord, California, a quorum being present, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2021, allows the board of supervisors and each city council within the district's boundaries to appoint members of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2020, states that a board of trustees shall establish policies for the operation of the district; and

WHEREAS, the California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2027, states at the first meeting in January every year, a board of trustees shall elect its officers; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees, at its meeting of March 8, 2010 adopted Resolution 10-1 establishing a procedure for electing the elected officers of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, it is advisable that the provisions of the referenced Resolution 10-1, along with additional provisions, be revised and included in this Resolution 20-02,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CONTRA COSTA MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT that the District hereby adopts the following procedure for annual election of officers in January of each year:

- 1. Elected officers of the Board shall consist of the President, Vice-President and Secretary.
- 2. Nominations for President, Vice-President, and Secretary shall come from the floor.
- 3. To be eligible for the office of President, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years, have served on at least two (2) different committees, and chaired at least one (1) committee. In addition, a candidate for presidency must have completed the first module of CSDA Special District Governance Academy courses, or the approved equivalent if these courses are discontinued, and have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.
- 4. To be eligible for the office of Vice-President, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years, have served on at least one (1)

committee, and have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.

- 5. To be eligible for the office of Secretary, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years and have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.
- 6. Prior to the January meeting each year, the General Manager shall prepare a list of eligible Trustees for candidacy to each Board officer position.
- 7. One (1) Trustee may serve as Board Secretary indefinitely, but election to this office must occur every January, along with the other Board officers.
- 8. Each Trustee present shall have one (1) vote for each elected office.
- 9. Elected President should not serve more than two consecutive years as President.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution 20-02 shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and that Resolution 10-01 is hereby rescinded and superseded in its entirety.

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2021, allows the board of supervisors and each city council within the district's boundaries to appoint members of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2020, states that a board of trustees shall establish policies for the operation of the district; and

WHEREAS, the California Health and Safety Code, Sec. 2027, states at the first meeting in January every year, a board of trustees shall elect its officers; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees, at its meeting of March 8, 2010 adopted Resolution 10-1 establishing a procedure for electing the elected officers of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees, at its meeting of January 13, 2020 adopted Resolution 20-2 revising the procedure for electing the elected officers of the Board of Trustees; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CONTRA COSTA MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT that the District hereby adopts the following procedure for annual election of officers in January of each year:

- 1. Elected officers of the Board shall consist of the President, Vice-President and Secretary.
- 2. Nominations for President, Vice-President, and Secretary shall come from the floor.
- 3. To be eligible for the office of President, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years, have served on at least two (2) different committees, and chaired at least one (1) committee. In addition, a candidate for presidency must have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.

- 4. To be eligible for the office of Vice-President, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years, have served on at least one (1) committee, and have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.
- 5. To be eligible for the office of Secretary, candidate must have been a Trustee at the Board of Trustees for a minimum of three (3) years and have attended two-thirds (2/3rds) of the previous year's Board of Trustee meetings.
- 6. Prior to the January meeting each year, the General Manager shall prepare a list of eligible Trustees for candidacy to each Board officer position.
- 7. One (1) Trustee may serve as Board Secretary indefinitely, but election to this office must occur every January, along with the other Board officers.
- 8. Each Trustee present shall have one (1) vote for each elected office.
- 9. Elected President should not serve more than two consecutive years as President.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution 20-4 shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and that Resolution 20-2 is hereby rescinded and superseded in its entirety.
